AGASTACHE (ANISE HYSSOP)

Location: Zone 3/4, sun to part shade, well-drained to moist soil

Shape: Upright

Foliage: Green, anise scent

Flowers: Purple spikes 3-6" long, June-September

Notes: Agastache which smells like licorice or anise, is a favorite of bees and butterflies.

Leaf tips can be eaten and made into teas. Native to North America.

Blue Fortune Agastache Blue Fortune'

36" x 18-24" Sun/part shade Zone 4

Upright habit with fuzzy green licorice scented leaves. Lavender-blue bottlebrush flowers bloom July to September and are a favorite among bees and butterflies. Tolerates dry soil.
