ASCLEPIAS (BUTTERFLY WEED)

Location: Zone 3, sun, dry to wet soil, Midwest native

Shape: Upright

Foliage: Glossy green, milky white sap inside stems

Flowers: Summer

Notes: Plants are slow to emerge in the spring. Native to eastern North America. Butterflies

are attracted by its brilliant flower color and its copious production of nectar.

Butterfly Flower Asclepias tuberosa

22-28" x 24" Full Sun Zone 3

Fragrant orange flowers from June to August. Glossy green foliage with milky white sap on the inside of leaves and stems. Attracts butterflies. Tolerates dry sites. Native.

Swamp Milkweed Asclepias incarnata

36-48" x 24-30" Sun/part shade Zone 3

Rosy pink flowers in July and August attracts bees and butterflies. Green, lance-shaped foliage forms upright clumps. Tolerates wet sites. Native.
