Location:Zone 4, sun, well-drained soilShape:MoundedFoliage:Silver or green, some varieties have wooly textureFlowers:Summer

Notes: Some varieties have silver, softly hairy leaves that feel similar to a lamb's ear. Other varieties have more coarsely textured, green leaves but tend to have showier flowers. Stachys are generally easy-to-grow perennials for moist, well-drained soils in full sun to light shade.

Soft, wooly, silvery white leaves resemble a lamb's ear. Purple flowers appear sporatically in whorls on hairy spikes. Forms a low growing mound and prefers well-drained soil.

Lavender-rose flower spikes bloom from June to August. Forms a mounded clump of long, narrow, coarsely textured, green foliage. Prefers well-drained soil.
