

BIRCH

Dakota Pinnacle®

Betula platyphylla 'Fargo' PP 10,963

30-35' x 8'

Sun/Part shade

Zone 3

Rigidly columnar, spire-like habit with pure white bark without the tendency to peel. Leaves are dark green with a wonderful golden fall color. Tolerates heat, drought, and heavy clay soil. Prone to bronze birch borer.



Dura Heat® River

Betula nigra 'BNMTF'

30-40' x 25-35'

Sun/Part shade

Zone 4

This River Birch cultivar features attractive creamy white peeling bark and has a dense crown of glossy green foliage that turns yellow in the fall. It is highly regarded for its heat and drought tolerance and resistance to bronze birch borer.



Emerald Flare®

Betula tianshanica 'EmerDak'

30-40' x 12-18'

Full sun

Zone 4

A narrowly pyramidal birch that has attractive white exfoliating bark with gray and slight orange undertones. Cold hardy (trials in 3b) and tolerant of higher pH soils and drought. Prefers well-drained soil.



Fox Valley® Little King

Betula nigra 'Little King'

10' x 12'

Sun/Part shade

Zone 4

Dense, compact, multi-stemmed birch with dark green leaves turning yellow in fall. Attractive peeling cinnamon colored bark adds winter interest. Does well in medium to wet soil.



Parkland Pillar®

Betula platyphylla 'Jefpark' PP 25,468

40' x 6-7'

Full sun

Zone 3

Narrow, upright pyramidal form with green foliage that turns golden in fall. Showy white bark adds winter interest. Flowers and fruit are not messy. Heat and drought tolerant; good resistance to deer.

River

Betula nigra

50-60' x 30-40'

Sun/Part shade

Zone 4

Oval crown grows rounded with age. Lustrous green leaves turn light yellow in fall. Exfoliating bark exposes the reddish-brown color on younger trees. Old bark becomes darker brown and ridged. Does well in wet or well-drained soils. Native.



BIRCH

Whitespire

Betula populifolia 'Whitespire'

40-50' x 20-30'

Sun/Part shade

Zone 4

Its narrow, pyramidal crown displays dark, glossy green leaves throughout the summer turning golden in the fall. White bark does not peel like River Birch. Heat tolerant.
