Achillea (Yarrow)

Location: Zone 3 to 4, sun, well-drained soil, tolerates hot & dry

Shape: Mat-like, clumping, upright

Foliage: Dark green to silvery green

Flowers: Late summer into fall

Notes: These hardy North American native perennials and the cultivated varieties have become staples in gardens around the world. They form soft, feathery, aromatic clumps, and are great filler plants and edgers. Deer and rabbit resistant.

Moonshine • Achillea 'Moonshine'

24" x 18-20"

Full Sun

Zone 3

Yellow, flat-topped flowers are held upright above the silvery-green foliage from June through September. Prefers well-drained soils and tolerates hot and dry sites.

Peter Cottontail • Achillea ptarmica 'Peter Cottontail' PPAF

18-24" x 28-30"

Sun/light shade

Zone 3

Large ivory white flowers cover the mound of green foliage. Individual flowers are larger and clumps are more spread out. Drought tolerant and long bloom time.

Strawberry Seduction • Achillea 'Strawberry Seduction'

18-20" x 18-20"

Full Sun

Zone 4

Strawberry red flower with a yellow eye blooms from June through September. Deep green foliage is more upright and uniform than the species. Prefers well-drained soil.
