# Aquilegia (Columbine)

Location: Zone 3, sun to shade, moist, well-drained soil

**Shape:** Graceful, elegant clump or mound

Foliage: Green, lacy

Flowers: Spring

**Notes:** Distinguished by leaflets arranged in groups of two or three and unique spurred flowers that are highly attractive to hummingbirds. Uses include rock gardens, shady borders or masses along walks or drives.

### Earlybird™ Blue & White • Aquilegia x hybrida 'Earlybird™ Blue White'

10-12" x 10-12"

Part sun/shade

Zone 3

Upward-facing, deep blue and white flowers bloom from May to June on a dwarf mound of lacy green foliage.

### Kirigami™ Deep Blue & White • Aquilegia caerulea 'Kirigami™ Deep Blue & White'

22-24" x 16-20"

Part sun/shade

Zone 4

Large, upward-facing flowers have a mixture of dark indigo blue and white shades creating a mound of color in late spring/early summer. Grows best in moderate to moist soil. Rabbit resistant.

### Songbird Blue Bird • Aquilegia x hybrida 'Songbird Blue Bird'

22-26" x 20-24"

Sun/part shade

Zone 3

Large, light blue and white flowers appear from May to June above a compact mound of green foliage. Adored by hummingbirds. Prefers well-drained soils.



## Winky Red & White • Aquilegia x caerulea 'Red & White'

18-20" x 16-18"

Part sun/shade

Zone 3

Upward-facing, red and white flowers bloom from May to June on a compact, upright form. Foliage is medium green and deeply cut.
