Baptisia (False Indigo)

Location: Zone 4, sun to part shade, wet to dry soil, Midwest native

Shape: Upright, shrub-like

Foliage: Blue-green, compound

Flowers: Late spring to mid summer

Notes: Baptisia is a member of the pea family and you'll notice a resemblance in its foliage and flowers. Black-brown seed pods appear from early summer until fall.

American Goldfinch • Baptisia 'American Goldfinch' PP 30,478

36-40" x 54-60" Sun/part shade Zone 4

Bright yellow spikes of pea-shaped flowers bloom for a prolonged period in late spring and early summer and are followed by large round seed pods. A large, problem-free perennial with a very long lifespan. Attracts pollinators.

False Indigo • Baptisia australis

36-42" x 36-48" Sun/part shade Zone 3

Dark blue, pea-like flowers from May to June, followed by black-brown seed pods. Bluegreen, compound leaves held upright on strong stems. Adapts to many soil types. Native.
