## Fern

**Location:** Zone 3-4, part sun to shade, moist sites

**Shape:** Upright, vase-shaped to mounded

Foliage: Light to dark green

**Notes:** Most ferns live in moist, shaded, fairly undisturbed spots. Not possessing flowers, ferns reproduce with spores, which are so small you can hardly see them with the naked eye.

#### Cinnamon • Osmunda cinnamonea

36-48" x 55-60" Part sun/shade Zone 3

Fronds are large and dark green turning golden brown in the fall. Vase-shaped and mounded growth habit. Prefers moist sites.



#### Ghost • Athyrium 'Ghost'

24-36" x 20-24" Part sun/shade Zone 4

Silvery fronds give it a ghost-like appearance. It has an upright growth habit and spreads slowly by rhizome.



#### Japanese Painted • Athyrium niponicum 'Metallicum'

12-16" x 12" Shade Zone 4

Wine red fronds take on a silvery sheen. Creates a small mound and prefers shade.



### Lady • Athyrium filix-femina

24-30" x 24" Sun/shade Zone 3

Lacy, light green fronds form a vase-shape. Prefers moist soil. Native.



#### Lady in Red • Athyrium filix-femina 'Lady in Red'

30-36" x 36" Part sun/shade Zone 3

Dark green fronds with deep burgundy stems grow in a vase-shape. Prefers moist soil.



# **Fern**

## Maidenhair • Adiantum pedatum

18" x 12"

Part sun/shade

Zone 3

Delicate, light green fronds with shiny, black stems have an upright growth habit. Prefers well-drained, alkaline soil. Native.



#### Ostrich • Matteucia struthiopteris

48" x 30"

Part sun/shade

Zone 3

One of the tallest ferns with lacy, arching, dark green fronds. Does best with rich, moist, acidic soil. Native.
