Oenothera (Evening Primrose)

Location: Zone 4, sun to part shade, heat and drought tolerant

Shape: Compact, low growing mound

Foliage: Glossy dark green

Flowers: Summer to fall

Notes: Following the large, canary yellow blooms, 4-winged seed pods are produced which are beautiful in dried floral arrangements. Ideal for softening the edges of pathways or planting in rock gardens.

Large, cup shaped, bright yellow flowers bloom from June through September followed by showy seed pods. Glossy, dark green foliage forms a low spreading mound. Heat and drought tolerant. Native.

Zone 4

Saucer-shaped, light pink flowers adorned with a white center and greenish-yellow throat rise above rosettes of narrow, serrated, green leaves. Its drought tolerance and spreading habit make it perfect for rock gardens.
