

Perovskia (Russian Sage)

Location: Zone 4, sun, well-drained soil

Shape: Upright, clumping

Foliage: Gray-green, toothed

Flowers: Late summer to fall

Notes: Perovskia is a woody sub-shrub with long panicles of lavender-blue flowers that become increasingly brilliant as they open. The foliage is finely cut gray-green leaves that are slightly scented.

Blue Jean Baby • *Perovskia atriplicifolia* 'Blue Jean Baby' PP 29,281

32" x 36" Full Sun Zone 4

Lavender-blue, feathery flowers are held in smoky purple calyxes and bloom midsummer extending into fall. One of the earliest Perovskia to bloom. The stems and foliage are very fragrant. Deer resistant; tolerates hot and dry sites.



Little Spire • *Perovskia* 'Little Spire' PP 11,643

26-30" x 18-20" Full Sun Zone 4

Upright clump of gray-green foliage with purple-blue flower spikes from July through September. Grows best in well-drained soil; heat and drought tolerant.



Russian Sage • *Perovskia atriplicifolia*

36-48" x 28-36" Full Sun Zone 4

Lavender-blue flower spikes bloom from July to September. Coarsely toothed, silver-green foliage grows in an upright clump. Prefers well-drained soil; heat and drought tolerant.
