## Autumn Jazz™ • Viburnum dentatum 'Ralph Senior'

8-10' x 6-8'

Sun/shade

Zone 4

Upright oval form with white flowers in spring give way to clusters of blue-black, drupe-like berries in summer. Showy, dark green, serrated leaves turn shades of yellow, orange, and burgundy in fall. Tolerates wet soil.



#### Blue Muffin® • Viburnum dentatum 'Chistom'

5-7' x 5-7'

Sun/shade

Zone 3

Compact Arrowwood type with beautiful flat-topped white flower clusters in spring, then clusters of rich blue berries in summer. Glossy green, serrated leaves turn orange to burgundy-purple in fall. Very versatile and tolerant of wet soil.





#### Compact American • Viburnum trilobum Baileyi'

5-6' x 5-6'

Sun/shade

Zone 2

Compact form of the American Cranberry with a more dense, slightly broader form and fiery red fall color. White, flat-topped flower clusters bloom in June and are followed by bright red berries. Tolerates wet or dry.



## Dwarf European • Viburnum opulus 'Nanum'

2-3' x 2-4'

Sun/part shade

Zone 4

No pruning required to maintain the dense, mounded habit. White flowers are sporatic and fruitless. Small, three-lobed, maple leaf-like, dark green leaves emerge red-tinged and have a green to reddish-purple fall color.



## Mohican • Viburnum lantana 'Mohican'

6-8' x 6-8'

Sun/part shade

Zone 4

Compact, rounded form with creamy white, flat-topped flowers in spring, followed by orange-red fruit in early July lasting a month before turning black in fall. Dark green foliage turns purplish-red in fall. Its compact, rounded form makes it a great



## Nannyberry • Viburnum lentago

15-20' x 6-10'

Sun/shade

Zone 2

Vase-shaped growth habit with upright arching branches. White flowers in spring become blue-black fruit in fall which birds enjoy. Glossy green foliage turns purplish red in fall. Very hardy and versatile, can be planted in sun or shade, wet or dry sites. Native.

#### Wentworth • Viburnum trilobum 'Wentworth'

10-12' x 10-12'

Sun/part shade

Zone 2

Attractive, white lace-cap flowers are displayed on a dense, upright form. Valued for its edible, large, bright red fall berries and excellent red fall foliage color. Grows best in moist, well-drained soil.
