

# Yew

## **Dwarf Bright Gold • *Taxus cuspidata* 'Dwarf Bright Gold'**

5-6' x 8'      Part sun      Zone 4

Dwarf, cone-shaped form with golden new growth in the summer that resembles a candle flame. Drought tolerant once established. Heat and wind tolerant. Shows good resistance to verticillium wilt. Deer and rabbit resistant.



## **Emerald Spreader • *Taxus cuspidata* 'Monloo' PP 10,335**

2' x 8-10'      Sun/part shade      Zone 4

The ideal low maintenance choice for large scale ground cover and embankment plantings or low hedges. Retains dark green foliage color in the coldest of winters. Red berries in winter.



## **Everlow • *Taxus x media* 'Everlow'**

2-3' x 4-5'      Sun/shade      Zone 4

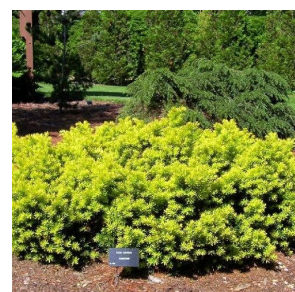
Low growing with striking green needles that are resistant to winter burn. It has a slow growth rate and maintains its short stature with little pruning. Showy red fruit. More sun tolerant than other cultivars.



## **Nana Aurescens • *Taxus cuspidata* 'Nana Aurescens'**

2' x 5-6'      Sun/shade      Zone 4

Low spreading with brilliant gold new growth which contrasts beautifully with the dark green older foliage. Slow growth rate and easy to maintain. Male cultivar that does not produce fruit. Very adaptable.



## **Nova • *Taxus cuspidata* 'Nova'**

6' x 3'      Part sun/shade      Zone 4

A slow growing, upright yew with dark green foliage and red berries in fall. Does well with shearing or can be left naturally shaggy. Long lived and tolerant of urban conditions.



## **Stonehenge® • *Taxus x media* 'SMNTHDC' PP31,795**

8-10' x 2-4'      Sun/shade      Zone 4

A narrow, columnar habit that does not need pruning to maintain shape. Fast growing with deep green foliage. Prefers part shade but can tolerate full sun or shade. Resistant to winter burn. Susceptible to deer damage.



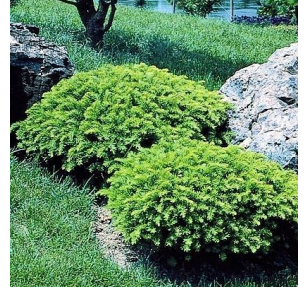

# Yew

## **Taunton • *Taxus x media 'Tauntoni'***

3-4' x 4-5'      Part sun/shade      Zone 4

Spreading form with dark green needles great for hedges, screens and foundation plantings. Noted for its resistance to winter burn and tolerance of summer heat. Red berries.



## **Upright Capitata • *Taxus cuspidata 'Capitata'***

12-15' x 5-6'      Part sun/shade      Zone 4

Dense, upright form with rich, dark green foliage. Tolerates shearing and can be used as a trimmed 8-10 foot hedge. Requires good drainage. Slow growing.
