

# Hydrangea (Tree Form)

## Fire and Ice™

*Hydrangea paniculata* 'Wims Red'  
PP26005  
H: 10-14' W: 6-10'  
Sun/part shade  
**ZONE 4**

Creamy white flowers appear in early spring, contrasting nicely against the bright green foliage. By mid summer, the flowers are a soft pink, and they continue to deepen to a burgundy red by fall.



## Fire Light®

*Hydrangea paniculata* 'SMHPFL'  
PP 25,135  
H: 6-8' W: 4-6'  
Sun/part shade  
**ZONE 4**



Strong, arching branches which remain upright even during the heaviest bloom time. Large white panicles quickly turn pink in the summer and deep red by fall. Prefers a well-drained soil.



## Limelight

*Hydrangea paniculata* '  
Zwijnenburg'  
H: 8-10' W: 6-8'  
Sun/part shade  
**ZONE 4**



Open and rounded with an upright growth habit. Fragrant, bright lime-green flowers appear in late summer. In autumn the blooms display shades of pink, burgundy and green. Prefers a well-drained soil.



## Little Lime®

*Hydrangea paniculata* 'Jane'  
PP 22,330  
H: 6-7' W: 4-5'  
Sun/part shade  
**ZONE 3**

Compact patio tree with huge lime green blooms that turn shades of pink and burgundy in the fall. Strong stems make for good cut flowers. Prefers well-drained soil.



## Pinky Winky®

*Hydrangea paniculata*  
'DVPPinky' PP 16,166  
H: 8-10' W: 6-8'  
Sun/part shade  
**ZONE 4**



Unusual blooms start out white in mid to late summer and turn pink from the base up, often leaving the tips white. Panicles are very pointed and can get to 16 inches in length. Rounded form with green leaves.



## Quickfire®

*Hydrangea paniculata* 'Bulk'  
PP 16,812  
H: 8-10' W: 4-6'  
Sun/part shade  
**ZONE 4**



Rounded and upright patio tree with conical flowers that start off bright white, then turn pink, then a deep pinkish-red. Blooms earlier and longer than other hydrangeas. Prefers moist, well-drained soil.



# Hydrangea (Tree Form)

## Vanilla Strawberry™

*Hydrangea. paniculata 'Renhy'*

PP 20,670

H: 8-10' W: 4-5'

Sun/part shade

**ZONE 4**



Flowers emerge white in the spring, then turn a shade of soft pink and finish off strawberry-red by late summer. Flowers are held upright on sturdy branches. All three colors may be present later in the season.
